

### I. REQUIRED MINOR

- City and Regional Planning: 12 hours (4 classes)
- Environmental Science: 15 hours (5 classes)
- Geographic Information Science: 18 hours (6 classes)
- Global Public Health: 15 hours (5 classes)
- Quantitative Economics 15 – 16 hours (5 classes)
